He holds certifications as an Active Shooter Instructor in both Law Enforcement and Civilian disciplines. He was a 12-year member of the North Eastern Massachusetts Law Enforcement Council (NEMLEC) Regional Response Team and is a graduate of the FBI Crisis Negotiation Course. Chief Cullen has earned two Master's Degrees, one in Criminal Justice Administration from Western New England College and the second in Leadership from Norwich University. He is a proud graduate of the 243rd Session of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

Chief Cullen presents at the FBINAA's ongoing School Shooting Prevention Leadership Forum series. Chief Cullen has provided training in the Leadership Forums in California, PA, and Chicago, IL and is scheduled to present at the 2019 Atlantic City, NJ and Boston, MA forums.
