He retired as the Chief of Police for the Flat Rock (MI) Police Department in 2014. He was appointed as chief in 2008. In 2006, he retired after 25 years of service as the Captain of Support Services with the Port Huron (MI) Police Department.
	He was the Director of Professional Development for the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police from 2014 until 2022.

He was responsible for creating the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Program and is the program director.

Mr. Rossow holds a master's degree and bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Wayne State University. He is a graduate of FBI National Academy (Session 212) and the Northwestern University Traffic Institute School of Police Staff and Command (Class 86).

He was an adjunct faculty member at the St. Clair County Community College from 1989 until 2021. He has taught at the basic academy level and for the IACP, FBI-LEEDA, Northwestern University, LLRMI, Eastern Michigan University, and the Virginia Center for Policing Innovation. He continues to be an instructor, a presenter and keynote speaker at numerous national and state conferences.
