Speaker's Biography	Scott Bieber is currently the Chief of Police for the City of Walla
	Walla, WA where he has served in that capacity since March of
	2012. Prior to joining the Walla Walla Police Department, Chief

Bieber worked for the Vancouver Police Department (WA) for 27 years, beginning his career in law enforcement in April of 1985. During his time with the Vancouver Police Department, Scott served under 10 different Police Chiefs and experienced several iterations of organizational culture, some good and some not so good. He rose through the ranks in the Vancouver Police Department working in almost every position and specialty area of the department, including a two-year stint as the Professional Standards Lieutenant. When he was offered the Chief's Position in Walla Walla, Scott was the Commander with the Vancouver Police Department, having commanded all five of the divisions at Vancouver during his tenure.

Chief Bieber has a BA in Communications from Portland State University, which he used to teach 7<sup>th</sup> grade English for two years prior to starting his career in law enforcement. While a Sergeant as Vancouver, Scott went to night school to complete a MA in Public Administration. He is a graduate of the 200<sup>th</sup> session of the FBI National Academy. He has also attended the Director's Leadership Institute at the London Business School as part of his 15 years as a Credit Union Board of Directors member.
